Keith Bowe requested that the Sorrento Road and Gulf Beach Highway studies be scheduled concurrently due to bottle neck concerns.

Thaddeus Davenport introduced himself as the new Deputy Director of Mass Transit at ECAT.

FDOT/ALDOT/ UPDATES:

1. FDOT Update - Bryant Paulk, AICP, or Christy Johnson, AICP, FDOT Urban Liaison

Bryant Paulk informed the committee about the SR 292 PD&E study that spans from the Theo Baars Bridge to Blue Angel Parkway. Bryant Paulk stated that there was a

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virtual project update made available in early November and that FDOT anticipates this being brought to a public hearing in mid-2025 with a completion of the study in early 2026. The construction estimate is a little over \$250 million.

2. ALDOT Update - Vincent Beebe, P.E., ALDOT

Jeremy Borden informed the board that the Waterways bridge project in Orange Beach is continuing as scheduled and should be completed in late 2025 or early FY 2026. ALDOT is continuing to work on the SR 161- SR 180 realignment project. Jeremy Borden stated that the Beaver Creek project on SR 180 should let the middle of 2025 and that there are a series of pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements project schedule on SR 182 in Orange Beach.

As a recipient of an SS4A Planning and Demonstration grant, ECRC, in partnership with Escambia County, will deploy innovative technological improvements and evaluate the safety impact of Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements on two of Pensacola's highest crash rate segments, Fairfield Drive and Pensacola Boulevard. These two corridors have been identified through the Emerald Coast Safety Action Plan as having critical issues such as low lighting, bicycle and pedestrian incidents, and left-turn crashes.

ORIGIN OF SUBJECT: FDOT

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTION NEEDED: None

BACKGROUND: Annually, the TPO adopts a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), which lists the projects scheduled throughout the five years of the FDOT Work Program for various phases such as project development and environmental study, design, right-of-way acquisition and construction. To receive federal funding, the project must be in the TPO's adopted TIP. This TIP amendment adds the SS4A Demonstration Project in FY 2024/2025 as a local project for a total cost of \$12,500,000.

On September 5, 2024, ECRC was awarded a \$10,000,000 million grant from USDOT as part of the National Roadway Safety Strategy to reduce traffic fatalities. As a recipient of an SS4A Planning and Demonstration grant, ECRC, in partnership with Escambia County, will deploy innovative technological improvements and evaluate the safety impact of Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements on two of Pensacola's highest crash rate segments, Fairfield Drive and Pensacola Boulevard. These two corridors have been identified through the Emerald Coast Safety Action Plan as having critical issues such as low lighting, bicycle and pedestrian incidents, and left-turn crashes. The local share is \$2,500,000.

Nearly 2,000 crashes were reported along Fairfield Drive, between Mobile Highway and Texar Drive from January 1, 2019 through December 31, 2023, including five fatalities and 39 serious injury cases. Crashes under dark conditions represented approximately 22% of overall crashes, but was a factor in more than 40% of fatal and serious injury crashes.

Similarly, Pensacola Boulevard, from "W" Street to Brent Lane reported more than 550 crashes during the same timeframe, including one fatal and eight serious injury crashes. However, this segment presented different obstacles, specifically for pedestrians.





ORIGIN OF SUBJECT: 23 Code of Federal Regulations Section 134(i), Chapter 339.175 (7) Florida Statutes, Florida–Alabama TPO Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Task C.2

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTION NEEDED: Provide review and input for Needs Plan projects for consistency with local comprehensive plans.

BACKGROUND: The TPO updates the LRTP Plan every five years. The current LRTP was adopted on October 14, 2020, as amended. The 2050 LRTP needs to be adopted by October 14, 2025. The 2050 LRTP Scope of Services was approved by the TPO on November 8, 2023. Some of the tasks identified in the LRTP Scope of Services are: Public Participation, Goals and Objectives, Evaluation Criteria, Congestion Management Process Update, Financial Resources, 2050 Needs Plan, and 2050 Cost Feasible Plan.

An important element in development of the FL-AL 2050 LRTP is the adoption of the Needs Plan. Projects enter the Needs Plan through one or more methods including development of an Existing Plus Committed (E+C) Network for projects completed or that will be completed between 2020-2028, the current Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) [FY25-29], adopted Priorities [FY25-29], capacity deficiencies identified by the Northwest Florida Regional Planning Model, ALDOT and FDOT input, the adopted Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan, the adopted Military Installation Resilience Review (MIRR), Steering Committee input (which includes local government and military input), and public input.

The LRTP Steering Committee met at Emerald Coast Regional Council on the dates listed below to provide input for, and to review the 2050 draft Needs Plan:

- August 12, 2024 (Steering Committee Meeting #5): Military and Freight
- September 16, 2024 (Steering Committee Meeting #6): ALDOT, Bike/Ped/Trail, Ports, and Transit
- January 22, 2025 (Steering Committee Meeting #7): Draft Needs Plan

Public outreach will occur in March 2025, followed by an additional Steering Committee review in April 2025. Needs Plan adoption is anticipated for May 2025.





LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTION NEEDED: None

BACKGROUND: Annually, the TPO reviews and adopts transportation project priorities in May for submittal to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) by October 1st. This document is part of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) development process. Its purpose is to ensure that transportation projects programmed by FDOT in the Five-Year Work Program are consistent with local needs and plans for the TPO planning area.

As stated in the TPO Public Participation Process Plan, the Project Priorities result from the Long Range Transportation Plan's Cost Feasible Plan and are reviewed with the public and the TPO Board and advisory committees annually. Once approved by the TPO Board, the Project Priorities are given to FDOT to develop the Five-Year Work Program. From the Five-Year Work Program, the TPO develops the TIP which contains all transportation programs and projects scheduled during the next five year cycle. The TIP is revised annually and is available, in interactive format, on the TPO's website.

The Project Priorities and TIP must be developed by the TPO in consultation with all interested parties and, at a minimum, describe explicit procedures, strategies, and desired outcomes for the following, as outlined by the Code of Federal Regulation (CFR 450.316) and the MPO Handbook:

- Provide reasonable public access to technical and policy information used.
- Provide adequate public notice of public involvement activities and time for public review and comment at key decisions, such as but not limited to the approval of the TIP/Project Priorities.
- Demonstrate explicit consideration and response to public input received during plan development process.
- Make the TIP and Project Priorities drafts and final documents available on the TPO website at www.ecrc.org, a print copy of the current plan is available upon request.
- Hold public meetings at convenient times and accessible locations.
- Seek out and consider the needs of those traditionally underserved by existing transportation systems, including but not limited to, low-income and minority households.
- Coordinate with the statewide transportation planning public involvement and consultation processes under 23 C.F.R. Subpart B, as described in the FDOT MPO Program Management Handbook.
- Periodically review the effectiveness of the procedures and strategies contained in the participation plan.
- When significant written and oral comments are received on a draft TIP or Project Priorities
 as a result of public involvement, a summary, analysis, and report on the disposition of
 comments shall be made part of the final documents.
- If the final Project Priorities/TIP differ significantly from the one made available for public comment or raises new material issues, an additional opportunity for public comment must be made available.

- When the Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) includes Indian Tribal Lands, the TPO shall appropriately involve the Indian Tribal Government(s).
- When the MPA includes federal public lands, the TPO shall appropriately involve the federal government.

General techniques proven effective include:

- Provide a 30-day public review and comment period for the draft Project Priorities documents.
- Promote development of the Project Priorities and TIP through news releases and social media, and eblast to TPO board and advisory committees, partners, stakeholders, community groups, and interested parties. (Subscribe online at www.ecrc.org)
- Hold public workshop(s) and implement additional project-specific outreach, as needed, to special populations during the Project Priorities process.
- Coordinate public outreach to community groups (with emphasis on the underserved).
- Include public input collected at workshops in the draft Project Priorities and TIP.
- Include in the public notice of the TPO board meeting when the draft Project Priorities and TIP are to be presented for review and adoption.
- Provide the public with an opportunity to comment during public forum when the draft Project Priorities and TIP are presented for review and adoption to the TPO board and advisory committee meetings.
- Publish adopted Project Priorities and TIP interactive site (provided by FDOT) on website at www.ecrc.org, a print copy of the current plan is available upon request.

Roy Remington, Director of Engineering at the Pensacola International Airport, thanked FDOT for partnering with the airport on the new parking lot spaces.

Jim Kauffman was voted to serve as temporary chair and called the meeting to order.

PUBLIC FORUM

Keith Bowe requested that the Sorrento Road and Gulf Beach Highway study be scheduled concurrently in the Priorities due to bottleneck concerns. Bryant Paulk stated that this project must be broken into segments in order for it to be funded. Keith Bowe asked that the Gulf Beach project could then be bumped up to directly follow the Sorrento Road project.

William Van Horn requested that SR 292 from Navy Boulevard to State Road 173, Blue Angel Parkway, be moved up on the list.

FDOT/ALDOT/ UPDATES:

1. FDOT Update - Bryant Paulk, AICP, or Christy Johnson, AICP, FDOT Urban Liaison

Bryant Paulk informed the committee about the SR 292 PD&E study that spans from the Theo Baars Bridge to Blue Angel Parkway. Bryant Paulk stated that there was a virtual project update made available in early November and that FDOT anticipates this being brought to a public hearing in mid-2025 with a completion of the study in early 2026. The construction estimate is a little over \$250 million.

2. ALDOT Update - Vincent Beebe, P.E., ALDOT

Jeremy Borden informed the committee that the Waterways bridge project in Orange Beach is continuing as scheduled and should be completed in late 2025 or early FY 2026. ALDOT is continuing to work on the SR 161-SR 180 realignment project. Jeremy Borden stated that the Beaver Creek project on SR 180 is working towards letting the middle of 2025 and that there are a series of pedestrian and bicycle safety improvement projects schedule on SR 182 in Orange Beach.

As a recipient of an SS4A Planning and Demonstration grant, ECRC, in partnership with Escambia County, will deploy innovative technological improvements and evaluate the safety impact of Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) improvements on two of Pensacola's highest crash rate segments, Fairfield Drive and Pensacola Boulevard. These two corridors have been identified through the Emerald Coast Safety Action Plan as having critical issues such as low lighting, bicycle and pedestrian incidents, and left-turn crashes.
